Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant Program	
PURPOSE	
<p>The Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant Program is a partnership among Sask Sport Inc., SaskCulture Inc. and the Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association Inc. and assists in the development of sport, culture and recreation programs by providing funds to non-profit organizations operated by volunteers.</p>	
ELIGIBILITY	
<p>Community Grants are determined by population. First Nations band councils, northern settlements and municipal governments are eligible to apply. These authorities distribute grants received from the Community Grant Program to local non-profit community groups to provide programs.</p>	
CRITERIA	
<p>Expenditures must be directly related to delivery of programs. Operational costs of facilities that are directly related to a program are eligible for 25% of the total grant for each program up to a maximum of \$500.00 per program.</p>

Community Vitality Program

The Community Initiatives Fund's newest program, the *Community Vitality Program*, offers grants to communities for small capital projects and special events. The program is designed to enhance accessibility and use of community facilities, encourage volunteerism and community involvement, and engage children, youth and families as Saskatchewan's community leaders.

Community grants through this program may assist communities with small construction projects or physical improvements to facilities. Projects involving youth leadership, Aboriginal inclusion, volunteerism or even activities that reduce financial or other barriers to participation may be eligible.

The "Community Pride Projects and Events" part of this program may also support efforts and events that commemorate the history and achievement of Saskatchewan communities. Projects that increase community leadership capacity in smaller, rural and Northern communities are also encouraged.

The Community Vitality Program is designed to invest in community projects and initiatives that can have a lasting impact on the economic, social and cultural aspects of community life in Saskatchewan.

Application deadlines are October 1st and April 1st.

Urban Aboriginal Community Grant Program	
PURPOSE	
<p>The purpose of the Urban Aboriginal Community Grant Program (UACGP) is to increase the participation and leadership of First Nations and Métis people in the development and delivery of culture, sport and recreation activities in urban centers. The program encourages inclusion of First Nations and Métis people in leadership and decision-making opportunities at the municipal level by providing funds for distribution to community initiatives that are initiated, adjudicated and delivered by First Nations and Métis people. The program encourages funds to be distributed among a balance of sport, culture and recreation activities in which the majority of participants are First Nations or Métis. The UACGP is jointly funded and managed by the Community Initiatives Fund (CIF) and the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation (SLTF).</p>	
ELIGIBILITY	
<p>Urban communities: City of Lloydminster; City of North Battleford; City of Prince Albert; City of Regina; City of Saskatoon and the City of Yorkton; Town of Battleford; Town of Meadow Lake; City of Melfort; Town of Kamsack; City of Estevan; Town of Fort Qu'Appelle; City of Moose Jaw; and the Town of Nipawin. Organizations that provide services First Nations and Métis people, and are located in one of the 14 eligible urban communities should contact their municipal recreation department to find out what grant support may be available.</p>	
CRITERIA	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Increasing the physical activity levels and fitness of First Nations and Métis people; 2. Encouraging projects and planning linkage and involvement with local schools; 3. Helping overcome barriers (i.e. Registration fees or equipment costs, transportation, childcare expenses, low skill development) that may restrict participation; 4. Fostering cultural awareness and knowledge, and 5. Identifying how the activity could become self-sustaining in the future.

Northern Communities and Schools Recreation Coordinator Program	
PURPOSE	
<p>The purpose of the Northern Communities and School Recreation Coordinator Program (NC&SRCP) is to enhance the quality of life for northerners through the provision of community based sport, culture and recreation programs after school, in the evenings, on weekends and at community and school special events. Community School Recreation Coordinators (CSRC's) are employed to facilitate the delivery of sport, culture and recreation programs, using the school as a major asset of the community and in partnership with other community based organizations providing sport, culture and recreation programs, services and facilities.</p>	
ELIGIBILITY	
<p>All Communities and First Nations located within the Northern Saskatchewan Administration District, who can establish a basic local partnership for programs</p>	
CRITERIA	
<p>Communities and First Nations within the Northern Saskatchewan Administration District will be selected based on their ability to meet the following objectives. This is initially accomplished through the development of a Letter of Intent and with community partners of which the School must be one, and finally with the development of a facilitated Community Plan to action the Letter of Intent.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To increase participation opportunities by providing sport, culture and recreation programs after school, in the evenings and on weekends, school holidays and at community and school special events; • To ensure community direction and support through the development of a community based steering committee; • To establish partnerships by sharing information and resources between schools and community organizations who share the mandate to provide community sport, culture and recreation programs; • To recruit, retain and support the community & school recreation coordinator through the provision of a positive work environment coupled with ongoing supervision, training and education support; • To increase the number of volunteers that assist with the management and coordination of sport, culture and recreation programs and services; • To increase community capacity by providing skill development and leadership development opportunities to members of the community; • To promote sport, culture and recreation programs as a positive wellness alternative and an important foundation for quality family life and community spirit.

Provincial Cultural Organizations – Annual Global Funding

PURPOSE

SaskCulture allocates funds to eligible Provincial Cultural Organizations (PCOs) serving the areas of Arts, Heritage and Multiculturalism. Grants currently support the annual operations of the PCOs as well as approximately 500 associated groups - some provincial, some regional and some local, through project and member funding. These diverse cultural organizations support a tremendous cultural infrastructure that empowers Saskatchewan’s cultural community to deliver a wide selection of cultural activities and services throughout the province. Many PCOs have funding programs which offer grants in the organization’s particular cultural discipline. See SaskCulture’s complete Funding Sources document for details.

ELIGIBILITY

PCOs are designated to be eligible to receive direct funding from the Culture Section of the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation by the Minister of Tourism, Parks, Culture and Sport. Organizations, which meet the criteria, can apply to be on the Minister’s Eligibility List.

CRITERIA

Eligible organizations are volunteer-based; incorporated for a period of at least two full years preceding the date of application; provincial in scope; do not duplicate the representation, mandate, governance, programs or services currently provided by another eligible organization; have a membership structure and/or program policy which promotes and provides universal access and participation; demonstrate sound financial and organizational controls, policies and management; and offer membership, participation, programs and services.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Annual grants to these organizations are adjudicated by either SaskCulture’s Cultural Advisory Committee or the Saskatchewan Arts Board.

Deadlines are according to each organization’s fiscal year-end.

PURPOSE	
<p>This program provides funding for a community, institution or workplace to assess and plan for the development of cultural and creative opportunities. The Partnership Explorations Grants Program is designed to facilitate change related to cultural development in Saskatchewan communities; and assist artists in the development of work, professional skills and knowledge.</p> <p>The objectives of the program are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to engage diverse community groups in creative cultural partnerships; • to give applicant partners the means to assess cultural resources in their communities; • to assist community partners in planning for creative cultural development in their communities. <p>This program includes a research component designed to help applicants articulate their rationale for proceeding with grant activity, document their process, reflect on what they learned and share their findings with others. Success with a Partnership Explorations Grant may support an application to the Partnership Innovations Grant or another community development grant program.</p> <p>Maximum grant available in \$7,500.</p> <p>The Saskatchewan Arts Board promotes, adjudicates and evaluates the program through a contractual arrangement with SaskCulture.</p>

Partnership Innovations Program

PURPOSE

Formerly called the Artist in Residence program, the **Partnership Innovations Grant Program** provides funding for a community, institution or workplace to form a partnership with a professional artist in any discipline to collaboratively engage the community in innovative activity in the arts and to create opportunities that increase access to artistic and cultural activity.

The objectives of the program are:

- to encourage innovative opportunities and access to arts and culture throughout the province;
- to provide artists with opportunities to develop their art practice within a variety of community contexts in Saskatchewan;
- to encourage development of future artists and cultural groups, and engage arts audiences throughout the province; and
- to increase knowledge about the value of creative arts partnerships within the community.

It is expected that the applicant will have gone through some process of assessing needs and planning for cultural development, such as offered through the **Partnership Explorations Grant Program**, prior to applying to this grant.

Maximum grants available are \$35,000 for a 12-month residency and \$30,000 for a 10-month K-12 schools-based residency. Artist partners in this grant program will live and work in the community, and have the opportunity to develop their own artistic practice throughout the grant period.

The Saskatchewan Arts Board promotes, adjudicates and evaluates the program through a contractual arrangement with SaskCulture.

ELIGIBILITY

The lead partner applicant must be one of the following Saskatchewan organizations:

- a non-profit organization;
- incorporated for-profit company;
- school division, cluster of schools within a division or a band school, or other education institution;
- health care or justice facility;
- incorporated municipality; or a
- First Nations Band

CRITERIA

The following criteria will be used in assessing the applications:

- **Artistic merit;**
If the artist partners has been identified at the time of the application, the jury will consider the artist's professional experience and work and the proposed programming is of high quality and has potential for innovation.
- **Impact on, benefit to, the identified community/communities;**
The proposed grant activity has the potential to help the community achieve its goals for innovative artistic development and it has the potential to reach a broad sector of the identified community.
- **Planning and strength of partnerships;**
The application shows evidence of in-depth, collaborative planning by the partners and there is evidence that the identified partners are seriously committed to the program.
- **Depth and significance of research question; and**
- **Support and level of contribution, both financial and in-kind, from the lead organization, the community to be served and the identified community partners.**
There is evidence that the lead organization is willing and able to provide leadership for the grant activity and the partners and community are willing and able to support the grant activity to ensure, as far as possible, the program's success.

Gallery Grant Program	
PURPOSE	
This program provides operational support to professional art galleries and artist-run collectives through the province. The Saskatchewan Arts Board promotes, adjudicates and evaluates the program through a contractual arrangement with SaskCulture.	
ELIGIBILITY	
Professional art galleries which: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Are open to the public at least 120 days per year;• Have been open to the public and fully operational for at least one year;• Have program objectives which fall under the Saskatchewan Arts Board mandate;• Are legally registered in Saskatchewan;• Are in the service of society and its development, and open to the public, which conserves, researches, communicates, exhibits and may acquire artwork for the purposes of study, education and enjoyment;• Have a permanent facility with public access and space designated for gallery use only.	
CRITERIA	
Galleries are assessed on the artistic impact and effectiveness of the organization and its programs on the basis of development, understanding and appreciation of the art and artists within the gallery's community and administrative effectiveness.

Métis Cultural Development Fund	
PURPOSE	
<p>The Métis Cultural Development Fund (MCDF) Program provides funding to support community based cultural activities and initiatives that preserve and pass on the Métis culture and traditions. An emphasis is placed on children and on building cultural leadership skills, transferring knowledge between generations, skills development, mentorship and having fun. The activities should encourage gathering, sharing, learning, celebrating and developing Métis culture in Métis communities.</p> <p>Since the inception of this program, Gabriel Dumont Institute has helped SaskCulture deliver this program. While applications now go directly to SaskCulture, applicants may still want to consult with GDI on past applications.</p> <p>The maximum grant available is \$10,000.</p>	
ELIGIBILITY	
<p>Non-profit, Métis, community-based groups, and/or Métis individuals engaged in a not-for profit activity at the community level, are eligible. Agencies that are directly connected to GDI, or the Métis Nation – Saskatchewan, are not eligible.</p>

Museums Grant Program

PURPOSE

This program provides operational support to museums throughout the province. The goals and objectives of the program include supporting and promoting the advancement of Saskatchewan museums towards operational excellence, and providing enrichment for Saskatchewan communities and protection of the human and natural heritage of the province.

Effective 2009, the MGP applications are submitted directly to SaskCulture. The Museums Association of Saskatchewan continues to provide Saskatchewan museums with resources and standards of museum excellence.

ELIGIBILITY

An institution must:

- Meet the following definition of museum "... a non-profit making institution in the service of society and its development, and open to the public, which acquires, conserves, researches, communicates, and exhibits, for the purposes of study, education, and enjoyment, material evidence of people and their environment";
- Be incorporated as a non-profit organization or be a public institution;
- Have been open to the public and fully operational for at least one year;
- Have a permanent facility with public access and space designated for museum/gallery use only;
- Hold clear ownership of a majority of items in its collection; and
- Maintain separate financial records

CRITERIA

The amount granted to each museum depends upon the following:

- The merit of a museum’s operations, as adjudicated by the peer Jury, utilizing the Museums Association of Saskatchewan’s Standards for Saskatchewan Museums – 2002;
- The number of museums applying for funds; and
- The total funds available in the program (as these are lottery proceeds the total funds available may vary from year to year).

The Museums Grant Program offers three streams:

- Stream I – up to 75% of the museum’s annual budget for the upcoming year, to a maximum of \$5,000
- Stream II - up to 50% of the museum’s annual budget for the upcoming year, to a maximum of \$10,000
- Stream III – up to 50% of the museum’s annual budget for the upcoming year, to a maximum of \$25,000

Capacity Building Grant

PURPOSE

SaskCulture Inc.'s Capacity Building Grant (CBG) aims to build the capacity of organizations to respond to emerging needs in the cultural community and to support new initiatives/opportunities outside of the current operations of the applicant.

The intent of the CBG program is to complement rather than replace or duplicate existing support to culture, and is therefore particularly targeted to areas not already funded.

This program strives to:

- Costs for standard board and staff activity
- Overhead administration costs;
- Capital expenditures, cash prizes, gifts, and the purchase of alcohol or food;
- Activity that exclusively promotes definable religious, spiritual, or political viewpoints;
- Allowances, wages or personal expenses for program participants; and
- Contributions of volunteer hours.

The value of donations of goods and services that reasonably replace eligible expenses must be included as both revenue (sponsorship) and as an expense for a balance of zero.

CRITERIA

Applications will be assessed by a volunteer committee according to the following criteria, which includes:

- Extent that the project will address the objectives of the grant;
- Quality of the proposal;
- Credibility of the application;
- Realistic and responsible use of resources;
- Potential for proposed initiatives to create lasting enhancements to the organization and its ability to engage Saskatchewan people;
- Extent to which the project presents significant opportunities to advance the course of culture in Saskatchewan;

- Organizations that provide services with First Nations and Metis people and are registered under the Saskatchewan Non-Profit Corporations Act
- Communities are eligible to apply provided endorsement is received from a Bonded Authorized Officer (i.e. Mayor, Reeve or Chief)
- Applications must include a detailed application, worksheets and Budget
- The application must demonstrate how the community intends to continue and sustain the sport program after the grant funding period has ended
- Applications must include worksheets from the “Planning Community Sport – A Workbook for Communities”
- Provide two letters of support from community leaders (i.e. school administrator, town administrator, minor sport organization president, recreation board chair, or community elected official)
- Sport Canada and Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation must be publicly acknowledged in all communications, correspondence and promotions as the source of funds for the program

CRITERIA

- The program grant period is nine months from date of grant application
- All activities and eligible expenditures must be expended within the fiscal period
- Retroactive funding for past or existing projects and activities is not eligible
- Extensions beyond the end of the grant period will not be allowed
- Programs must meet one or more of the following objectives:
 - Aim to increase the number of long-term organized sport programs involving First Nations and Métis children and youth
 - Provide opportunities for ‘new’ organized sport programs in the community or provide extended, sport participation opportunities within existing community sport programs for children and youth who may not otherwise have the opportunity to participate
 - Strive for gender equity, youth participation and parental involvement in identifying local sport priorities, as well as involvement in planning and delivering new sport initiatives
 - Increase the number of First Nations and Métis people involved in leadership capacities (coaching, organizing, volunteering, etc.) for sport initiatives
- The majority of sport program participants must be of First Nations and Metis descent, with the programs to be directed at the residents of the community

Tribal Council/First Nation Coordinator Program

PURPOSE

This program provides funding to assist with employment and travel costs for a Coordinator, focusing on the following major objectives within First Nation Communities: increase the number of volunteers, increase participation opportunities, training and opportunities in leadership development, link with existing agencies and resources, development, educational and consultative support and to promote the benefits of participation.

ELIGIBILITY

Tribal Council/First Nations currently on the eligibility for Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation as recognized by the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations Chiefs Legislative Assembly and the Minister responsible for Lotteries are eligible.

CRITERIA

The application must be reviewed and approved by the Tribal Council Executive/First Nation Chief & Council prior to submission. It is also the Tribal Council/First Nation Executive's responsibility to meet on a regular basis throughout the year to monitor and oversee the Tribal Council's sport, culture and recreation budget and activities.

The application must consist of an annual plan and budget for the development of sport, culture and recreation in the Tribal Council/First Nation. The annual plan must be clearly defined and contain measurable objectives.

Saskatchewan Lotteries must be promoted and recognized at all major events and within all communications and resources developed.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Deadline for application is March 1st.
