- Saskatchewan Heritage Foundation (SHF)
- Saskatchewan Arts Board (SAB)

Saskatchewan Arts Board

Established by the Government of Saskatchewan in 1948, the Saskatchewan Arts Board is the oldest arts funding agency of its kind in North America. It provides grants, programs and services to individuals and groups whose activities have an impact on the arts and artists in Saskatchewan. The Arts Board also provides awards for outstanding lifetime achievement in the arts, and collects and displays works of art by Saskatchewan artists.

In addition to its regular programs, the Saskatchewan Arts Board has created two programs aimed at increasing participation and access to its public funding by the Indigenous artists of the province. The Indigenous Pathways Initiative includes the Traditional Arts Grant and the Contemporary Arts Grant which support Indigenous artists' work in contemporary and/or traditional art forms.

The **Community Initiatives Fund (CIF)** was created by the provincial government in 1995 to ensure that Saskatchewan communities received tangible benefits from casino profits. The CIF receives a portion of profits from the Regina and Moose Jaw casinos. The Fund is managed by an independent government-appointed Board. Board members all have extensive experience as community volunteers.

The CIF provides grants to community initiatives that enhance human development and community vitality, focusing on:

- development opportunities for children, youth and families;
- increased positive activities for young people at the local level, including physical activity, and arts and culture activity;
- increased community leadership capacity, particularly leadership opportunities for youth; and,
- inclusion of First Nations and Métis people as leaders in delivery of community activities.

The CIF is intended to support off-reserve activity. Community organizations including First Nations and Métis organizations may apply directly to the CIF or form partnerships to deliver off-reserve projects. Many projects supported by the CIF benefit First Nations and Métis people living off-reserve.

Community Grant Program: Annual grants are for projects that will be delivered throughout the year. Summer grants assist community organizations in providing summer projects between May and September. Funding is available to an incorporated Saskatchewan non-profit corporation and/or a community-based or voluntary Saskatchewan group that is endorsed by a recognized partner organization such as a municipality, school, school division or health region.

Since 1997/98, this program has focused on human development, supporting community projects and activities that improve the education, health, and/or well-being of children, youth, and families. Projects are supported in priority areas that focus on prevention and early intervention, as opposed to crisis intervention. Grant applications are reviewed by the Regional Intersectoral Committees (RICs). These committees provide funding recommendations to the CIF board. The CIF board makes all final grant decisions.

The CIF board contracts Sask Sport to provide grant administration and financial management services.

Urban Aboriginal Community Grant Program:

Provides grants for projects that will increase access to and assist in the development of sport, culture and recreation programs and leadership opportunities for First Nations and Métis people in designated urban centers.

The lottery-funded system invests with the Community Initiatives Fund in the Urban Aboriginal Community Grant Program. The program is coordinated provincially by Sask Sport. There are 14 communities participating in this program based on their high urban Aboriginal population. The municipalities offering the program are: Regina, Saskatoon, Yorkton, Prince Albert, Moose Jaw, Lloydminster, North Battleford, Battleford, Melfort, Nipawin, Estevan, Kamsack, Meadow Lake and Fort Qu' Appelle.

Community organizations that provide services with First Nations and Métis people apply to the program through the municipality. The municipalities help administer the program, work to decrease the barriers that inhibit participation by First Nations and Métis people and identify local program priorities. The municipalities have established Urban Aboriginal Advisory Committees to support program implementation and the review of grant requests. Urban Aboriginal Grant Program Application Guidelines are available through participating municipalities. Each municipality has tailored the program to meet local needs. As delivery partners, municipalities are accountable to the CIF board to ensure the program objectives are met and that appropriate grant review processes are in place.
